CHRISTOPHER signed up to volunteer at MEND just before the Los Angeles *Safer at Home* order went into effect in March 2020. But when the quarantine invariably happened, it did not stop him. Seeing the long lines for food form overnight he agreed to stay and help. He says: "I wanted to extend the love and care I have received

in my community to others."

### **KARLA'S** Journey

KARLA spent most of 2020 worrying about finances. But because of your support she and her family received the help they needed during the toughest times. "I have no idea what I would have done if MEND did not exist."

Like so many of the families you helped in 2020, Karla was often unsure if they would make it. She shares: "My husband lost his job and we struggled with rent and food." She adds: "I go once a week

to pick up food from MEND, every Friday. They even give me diapers. And I also receive extras that help, like cleaning supplies to help me disinfect the house."

But, 2020 was not all bad for Karla's family. They welcomed their beautiful baby boy, Jesus, during the pandemic.

The small family tries to take things day-by-day, and Karla confesses that the stress sometimes keeps her up at night. But despite the difficulties she tries to pay your generosity forward by preparing

meals from the food she receives from MEND for her 92 year old neighbor so that he does not go without a home cooked meal.

Karla shares, "I see so many people in need living on the streets, or like my neighbor who

### 10,000 PPE kits and messages of hope to thousands of people

MEND's Emergency Foodbank & Food Pantry is the San Fernando Valley's largest and as the pandemic hit in early 2020, we saw an immediate doubling then tripling in numbers of people needing help. The drive-through and walk-up lines have remained long throughout the year, and because of your help, we have served every single person in line week after week, as well as community partners with non-perishables, meat, eggs, dairy and fresh fruits & vegetables.

As the northeast Valley became the epicenter for COVID-19 cases in Los Angeles, our **Hope & Care** program sent out outreach teams to share information on testing, mental health resources, and distribute thousands of PPE kits.

Families that elect to participate in oneto-one coaching to help them overcome long-term challenges receive help from our Family Support Program case team.

We took some time to celebrate the holidays in 2020, including a chicken in every food box in November and December, along with a number of festive offerings. Over 130 children received toys, blankets and other donated gifts.
