JOB SUMMARY: Under the direction of the Senior Community Ambassador, the Community Ambassador I is responsible for providing direct support, information, and resources to individuals and families to address the social service needs as a result of continued health disparities and other social determinants of health that persist in our communities. The Community Ambassador will conduct community outreach through virtual events, in-person events, tabling, and door-to-door canvassing, providing information on MEND services, Mental Health Best Practices, Social Determinants of Health, Community Resiliency Model, and resources and referrals. The ideal candidate will have previous community organizing experience and strong formal and informal networks in our target communities within SPA 2.

ESSENTIAL FUNCTIONS:

- 1. Conduct outreach in an effort to bring awareness of services available through MEND and/or other community agencies primarily through:
 - a. Door-to-door canvassing
 - b. Tabling at events and non-events
 - c. Other outreach methods as assigned.

- 2. Conduct and coordinate trainings for community members on the Community Resiliency Model, COVID safety, and others that benefit general wellbeing and safety.
- 3. Support the distribution of concrete supports to community members through the Diaper Distribution, First Steps, Hope Wellness Care and other onsite and offsite events as assigned.
- 4. Prepare and assemble required materials (flyers, kits, concrete support, etc.) for:
 - a. Essential item delivery to households in quarantine or isolation
 - b. Event distribution
- 5. Supports organizing and recording donated supplies.
- 6. Maintains knowledge and awareness of the Community Ambassador Network through active participation of required trainings and meetings.
- 7. Complete and submit Daily Activity Data reports to Lead on a daily basis.
- 8. Other duties as assigned and relevant to the project.

PHYSICAL REQUIREMENTS:

- Ability to occasionally move supplies and equipment weighing up to 50 lbs for various outreach event needs and frequently lifting of up to 25 lbs, with constant lifting of small objects.
- Frequently assemble, lift and carry materials and supplies required for activity.
- Perform sustained, repetitive, manual and circular motion tasks with the upper extremities.
- Must be willing to frequently be on feet 4-6 hours of a nine-hour day.
- Must be willing to constantly work in outdoor temperatures with a frequency of being in noisy and dusty environments.

QUALIFICATIONS:

- High School Diploma or Equivalent, required
- Bi-lingual; fluency in languages such as Spanish, Tagalog, Armenian, and American Sign language are required
- Experience with community organizing 2 years minimum required
- Existing formal and informal networks in Service Planning Area 2, required
- Understanding of available public and private supports for holistically increasing an individual's mental wellness.
- Experience in leading engaging presentations/teaching/coaching type sessions
- Ability to work independently and as a team player.
- High energy, friendly, organized, and detailed-oriented.
- Valid CA Driver's License and Current insurance; Must have reliable transportation, position requires extensive local travel
- Excellent internet and research skills; Proficient in Microsoft Office (Word, Excel, Access, PowerPoint);
- Excellent communication and organizational skills; strong written and interpersonal skills
- Experience working with individuals with diverse ethnic backgrounds

• Must be willing to work a flexible schedule to accommodate outreach activities.

Time Commitment:

Full time temporary position 70 hours per bi-weekly pay period (weekly schedule may vary based on community events and organizational needs). Grant term: July 1, 2023-December 22, 2023, with the possibility of extension. Must be able to work a flexible schedule which will include occasional evenings and weekends. Position requires extensive local travel.
